

Recently one of our students was walking with his Chaplain along the streets of Skid Row when the student saw a man sleeping on the street with no shoes. When asked why he did that, the student said, "I saw the need and I knew how he must have felt, because I was once in his condition."

That incident sums up everything we do at the Los Angeles Mission. We are able to be kindness in action because your prayers and donations allow us to reach out to so many in need. You help us turn hopelessness into hope and chaos into lives worth living. For so many, depression and despair are constant companions...so we do all we can to help those who struggle with mental challenges. Darrel's Story

...until I finally arrived at the Los Angeles Mission ... with stops along the way, which included a year in prison, around-the-clock depression, alcoholism and 12 suicide attempts. When things were going well I had a good job as an anesthesia tech at UCLA. But not even that was enough to give meaning to my life. Meanwhile, my depression continued, which ultimately led to criminal behavior. I was finally locked up for assaults and batteries.

I'll never forget the day I was on my way from County Jail to court. When I arrived at the courthouse I caught a view of myself in a large mirror. I hated what I saw. There I was in

a jumpsuit and wearing handcuffs—a singular moment that turned my life around. I said to myself this is not who I am, and this is not who I want to be.

By the grace of God I came to the Mission while on parole. Here, as a student in the program, I'm learning what it means to be alive in Christ. I am also understanding the origin of my despair and depression—something God has taken away through prayer and meditation. I don't know where I would be today without the Mission and my mentor Chaplain Lewis, who continues to stand with me every step of the way.

I also want to say how much I love you. I don't know you personally, but I can honestly say you have saved my life. So when I say I love you it comes from the depths of my heart. I have gone from a life of hopelessness to one of hope, peace and joy. God bless you for caring so much.
