"Thank you for putting a roof over my head while I rebuild my life!"

Every day as he heads to class, Nicholas is thankful to have a roof over his head. Because a time when he didn't is never far from his memory.

His parents had been teenagers when they had him and he spent much of his childhood shuffling between relatives' homes. As a teenager he was introduced to drugs and that led him to criminal activity and jail time. When he was released from prison, he had no support system and nowhere to go. His parole officer told him about Los Angeles Mission's Recovery Program.

Rebuilding Lives at the Anne Douglas Center for Women

With your help, Valerie went from addiction to starting a new journey

Reaching midlife can be a turning point for many people. At 51, Valerie knew she had reached that pivotal moment. So when she arrived at the Anne Douglas Center almost two

years ago, she was ready to begin a completely new journey.

Born and raised in Florida, Valerie was one of nine children who grew up in a time and place where you didn't talk about painful things . . . like being abused by your stepfather. As she struggled alone in the aftermath, Valerie turned to drugs to numb the pain.

"I was like a horse with blinders on, no one knew how sad I was," says Valerie. "I was smiling, so no one could see the hurt. But I knew the drugs weren't making me feel better, they were making it worse." At the Anne Douglas Center she found the support she needed to not only kick the drugs, but to reestablish her relationship with God.

Valerie completed her GED and, inspired by her Bible study classes, she's hoping to become a minister. "God fixed my heart," Valerie says. "He's a miracle worker. I feel a sense of peace and my eyes are open."

Valerie is thankful to donors, like you, who made it possible for her to begin a new, sober life at the Anne Douglas Center. A journey she begins every day by waking up and thanking God!

Thanks to your generous support, beautiful new beginnings are written every day at Los Angeles Mission. Each of the three phases of our program are designed to support individuals as they heal from the past, learn new life skills, and look forward to a brighter future:

- The **JumpStart** induction period is the one month beginning of the program, which allows candidates to get acquainted with the program and decide if they want to make a one-year commitment.
- During the one year **Fresh Start Rehabilitation Program** individuals commit to a healing process that addresses their individual physical, mental, emotional and spiritual needs. In addition to rehabilitation, all students are required to pursue academic studies and vocational training. Christian discipleship classes, individual counseling, and other curriculum also help them re-integrate into society.
- Upon completion, graduates may apply to the **LifeStart Program** that supports that transition with an additional six months of career and housing support services.

These programs help graduates make real and lasting life changes and are only possible because of your generosity and compassion!
