One homeless family, two Fresh Starts

MaryRobin and her son James came to the Mission after four years of being homeless to find a new focus and a new hope.

I'm a single mom—I raised four children, explains MaryRobin. My three sons have disabilities, and I took them to doctor appointments and therapy appointments for 22 years. At that point, I gave up on everything and had a mental breakdown

I made a bad choice and left my apartment. I was in addiction— I used marijuana for 35 years and also started using methamphetamine. That's why we ended up homeless. Two of my sons were incarcerated at the time and James, my middle son, went homeless with me.

The first night

One day my mom just said, "Pack up the stuff, we're going." I didn't understand what was going on at first, says James.

The first night we were homeless, my mom and I stayed under a bridge down the street from where we used to live. I had to make sure our stuff wasn't stolen and that my mom was OK. Being out there with my mom was heartbreaking—I never thought it would have to come to that point.

We started smoking meth before we were homeless and it only got worse once we were on the streets. It helped me to not feel hungry all the time and helped me stay awake so my mom could sleep and I could watch our stuff.

We were living on the riverbed in Long Beach, in parks, or in an underground tunnel, depending on the day. During my homelessness I would look down the riverbed and ask myself, "What am I going to do with my life?"

Running through the door

I knew the Lord was with me the whole time I was homeless, says MaryRobin. I told the Lord, "I apologize, I repent. Please tell me where you want me to go." Then the Lord led me here to the Mission and He opened that door. And let me tell you, I ran through that door.

Once I was here, I told James, "Come here to the

Mission. You'll like it a lot." He staved with me the whole time I was homeless. He was there every single day. He protected me. He kept me company. He really saved my life.

Being here makes you feel good about yourself again, and that's why I want to thank the donors for being gracious and giving from their heart. It's the most awesome thing that anyone could receive from them—another chance at life.

Finding a place of refuge

My mom motivated me to come to the Mission, recounts James. I decided I was tired of being on the streets. Now. they are teaching me skills here and preparing me for life. I am learning more and more every day.

The Mission has given us a place of refuge. It's given us a hope for a new future. It's keeping us from our past and helping us grow together. We get to see each other every day and say "Hi, how are you doing?" That's a blessing right there, seeing my mom and knowing she's safe.


