The Mission and my chaplain have been great liaisons to Veterans Affairs for me, which has helped me gain access to benefits and opportunities I wasn't aware of. I'm on a good path now to achieving my goals—the Mission has helped me focus on what I need to do to get my life back in order.



It's a biblical truth that "people are destroyed for a lack of knowledge."
Likewise, people experience ill health and are adversely impacted by a lack of understanding about proper nutrition—especially the links between food, health, and addiction recovery.

One of our goals at the Anne Douglas Center is to increase education and awareness of proper nutrition among our students. Often the women entering the Anne Douglas Center have a tendency to substitute food for previous sources of addiction. Therefore it becomes critical that they learn more about the link between food, nutrition, and health in order to heal. We know that mental, physical, and emotional wellbeing is a paramount component to any recovery program.

And to that end, Chef Katherine Lewis has joined the team at the ADC, with a desire to shift the way the ladies think about food. Through a focus on nutrition education, and aligned with the goals of our program, Chef Kathy will teach the

women how to enjoy, live and heal their bodies and minds through healthy eating.

She will provide the discipleship needed to inspire the women through vocational therapy in food services and as a family ministry, teaching them how to shop on a small budget, the importance of good food choices, adequate meal preparation and healthy menus.
