CREATING A LEGACY: Avoiding potential family landmines

The Australian Army began recruiting dogs to track alongside soldiers during the Vietnam War. Journalist and veteran Peter Haran says he owes his life to one such dog—Caesar. In August 1967, Caesar and Haran were leading a team of men when the dog "suddenly stopped tracking, returned to me and sat on my foot. At that second a mine behind me detonated, seriously wounding five men and almost knocking me out." After recovering from the shock, "trained engineers walked ahead of me and found a huge, unexploded bomb wired to other mines." (Story adapted from "My Dog Saved Me.")

Today we would never think of going into a minefield unprepared! But over 70 percent of Americans are doing it every single day...by not creating an estate plan.



She asked me right there in the kitchen what I wanted to do for the rest of my life. I told her I would like to run a salon for the homeless. Then, Vera and actress Beth Broderick paid for me to go to cosmetology school. I couldn't believe it.

I worked in Vera's salon for $7\frac{1}{2}$ **66** She asked me right years. For the past 15 years, I've run a full-service salon at People Assisting the Homeless (PATH) in Los Angeles. My dream came true.

I have lived on my own for 21 years and never missed a day of rent. I have two daughters who live on their own now, and one is a licensed cosmetologist like me. I've been

This year, the Anne Douglas Center celebrates 25 years of changing women's lives in Los Angeles. And it all came about thanks to a simple question.

Anne Douglas happened to be at the Mission when her husband, actor Kirk Douglas, was speaking at an event. She asked, "Where are the women?"

When a Mission staff member pulled back a curtain to reveal only a few bunk beds, Anne Douglas felt compelled to give homeless women a place of their own to recover and put their lives back together.

Today, the Anne Douglas Center is a thriving community with a day center, showers and a computer center. Women can receive hot meals, donated clothing and holistic care that helps them physically, emotionally and spiritually.

Dr. Roxanne Jordan, vice president of the ADC, says it's not just the quality of care that has helped keep the center going, but the loving, supportive community of women.

"For me, everyone involved with the Mission over the past 25 years has contributed to the success of the Anne Douglas Center; however, the underlying source, focus or impetus for change must be attributed to Mr. and Mrs. Douglas" Dr. Jordan says. "There are many people who are founders of organizations and even contributed generously in terms of funding, but rarely do they show up year after year. Mrs. Douglas is hands-on, approachable, and warm and endearing to all the women in the program."

Programs that build a brighter future

It's our mission to provide help, hope and opportunity for all women who come through the doors of the Anne Douglas Center, as well as their children.

We have many quality programs available, like our Mommy and Me classes (dads are welcome too!), that provide basic parenting skills and a sense of community for the parents. Everyone receives a meal, the kids get to do crafts and the parents can "shop" for their families from clothes that have been donated to the Mission.

"I don't think people realize sometimes the importance and power of having somewhere to get a good meal and have good clothing," says Dr. Roxanne Jordan, vice president of the ADC. "Their children feel good in this community, and their esteem is built up."

Our art therapy classes give women an alternative way to do counseling that doesn't just heal the logical side of the brain, but the emotional too. To help the women heal physically, we partner with health clinics in our community and also have classes that emphasize the importance of nutrition and fitness.
