After a combined 26 years of being part of the Los Angeles Mission family, Victor and Rudy are familiar faces to staff, guests and donors. The two also know, better than most, the powerful impact donor support has on the lives of people who come to the Mission for help.

Victor graduated from the Fresh Start program in November 2000 and is the Lead Operations Coordinator at the Mission. In the many roles he performs, Victor receives in-kind donations like clothes and hygiene supplies and puts them into the hands of guests. He says, "However large or small a donation is, it's a blessing! Every donation gives our guests dignity."

Though it's been many years since he arrived at Los Angeles Mission, Victor remembers his negative feelings. "I'd gotten involved with a gang at 13, got shot five times and went to prison. I arrived full of the racial prejudice I'd learned there. Thankfully, God intervened. Since coming to the Mission, I have God in my heart and I see people, not colors."

After being homeless for many years and living under a bridge, Rudy came to the Mission in 2009 hoping for a safe place to sleep. "When I first arrived, I only cared about myself. Today, I care about others and want to help. Being at the Mission has taught me about reading the Bible and about God. I'm grateful for that." Rudy graduated from Fresh Start in 2011 and returned two years later to work with Victor as an Operations Assistant.

Both men are thankful for donors who continue to support the very place that helped them begin new lives. Each of them also pays forward the kindness they received by offering encouragement to people in the program today. "When I see someone struggling . . . I tell them to pray for patience; it takes time," says Victor. And Rudy adds, "I try to help people to stay positive. Believe in God — He'll pull us through. You have to hang tight. The program does work!"

Homeless Mother Finds Healing Thanks to Your Support

There was a time when Tina thought she had what any mother could want. Healthy children. A good home. A loving husband. Until the day she discovered his unfaithfulness.

She spiraled into despair. To ease the pain of her divorce, Tina began drinking. But she lost control. Her children rejected her.

Tina's dream life became a nightmare as she found herself on the streets with a man she grew up with as a child. A man she thought might help turn her life around. A man who began abusing her terribly.

"He beat me so much," Tina says. "He knocked my teeth out, he blackened my eye and then he broke my finger because I was trying to hide my face from him."

Thankfully, he was arrested, and she was taken to the hospital. There, Tina reunited with her mother, whom she hadn't talked to in 15 years. Her parents encouraged her to enroll at the Anne Douglas Center for Women.

There, with the help of our counselors, Tina was able to begin healing.

"I've changed so much. I feel so much at peace. I have no fear," she says.

Healthy and whole again, Tina has reunited with her children and was ecstatic to learn she is now a grandmother!

"I'm getting my family back, I'm getting my life back together and I'm being the mother that my kids want," she says.

"More people in Los Angeles are falling into homelessness for the first time than ever before," explains Herb Smith, President and CEO of Los Angeles Mission.

- 3. **Words of encouragement.** Nothing makes a person's heart swell quite like "I love you." Are there especially meaningful or encouraging words or Scriptures you want to leave with those you love most?
