The Determination to Become a Changed Man

Wendell made the choice, but your gifts gave him the chance.

Wendell experienced a lot of rock bottoms when he was abusing drugs and alcohol. He wanted to live a sober life and thought he could do it on his own. He tried and tried, but it didn't work — he just kept backsliding. "You can't live and die at the same time," Wendell says. "But that is what I was doing."

When Wendell came to Los Angeles Mission, his mind was made up. This time, he would succeed. "I really focused and paid attention," he says. He participated in group and one-on-one counseling, faithfully attended classes and worked out every day to get physically healthy as well. "I kept my hope in God and let nothing deter me or take me off track," Wendell says.

His hard work paid off. Wendell graduated, and today he's working for a ministry, sharing his testimony to help others dealing with similar problems. "Everybody at Los Angeles Mission played a gigantic part of me being where I'm at today," Wendell says. "I never lived like this before, going through life, living sober, living guilt-free . . . the future looks great!"

Starting Over Step by Step, with Your Help

Delores had never been in trouble with the law whatsoever. But at 51 years old, an ill-fated relationship ended with her going to prison. "I got involved with a man, and I fell for his lies. I did whatever he told me," she recalls. It cost Delores her freedom and much more. "I lost everything," she says. "My home, my kids, my family . . . everything!"

When Delores was released from prison, she contacted the Anne Douglas Center. She remembers praying, "God, I don't have anywhere to go. If they don't help me, I will be on the streets." Thankfully, because of support from donors like you, we were there for Delores.

"I had never been in a program or a shelter before," Delores says. "But I told myself that I would never go back to prison, and every day I reminded myself, 'I'm going to make it through." And she did! Delores graduated from the Fresh Start program and has now applied for our Life Start program to continue rebuilding her life and preparing for a new career.

"I appreciate Los Angeles Mission," Delores says. "It teaches you to be humble and to be kind because you never know what someone's going through." Thank you for giving women like Delores access to the steps they need to regain their faith, courage and belief in themselves for a better life.
