Brothers Daniel and Christian moved from the Midwest to Los Angeles to pursue their dreams in the music industry. To supplement their income while following their passion, Christian found a job as a security guard, and Daniel began working at a local restaurant. But soon, their dreams became nightmares. The high cost of living left them struggling to survive. Unable to afford their apartment, they had no choice but to live on the streets and sleep outside. Thankfully, a friend told them about Los Angeles Mission.

At the Mission, the brothers found an answer to their prayers—our Bridge Program. It provides temporary shelter, meals and care for people who are employed but need time to get back on their feet. Now,

Daniel and Christian are safe from the streets and crime. They're using our resources to prepare to move into permanent housing — with money in savings — and also fine-tune their goals and future plans.

"The Mission is a place where people can grow and change," Daniel says. "The Bridge Program helped me understand when you have a fall in life, you get back up. It helps give you the power to get back up and fight and live again."

## A Mother and Son Reunited, Thanks to You

Alejandra is grateful for every night she spends indoors with a roof over her head — because she will never forget the times that she couldn't.

Haunted by the trauma of her past, Alejandra had turned to drugs to cope with her inner pain. One bad choice led to another, and the consequences compounded. She lost her home, her children and her freedom.

Unfortunately, the cycle of homelessness also affected her son Ricardo. Despite being adopted by his grandmother, Ricardo was lost in a haze of drugs and bad decisions — just like his mother.

When the courts directed Alejandra to Los Angeles Mission last year, she felt relieved and grateful. She knew this was her best opportunity to become the person she always wanted to be.

Alejandra took classes to build her life skills and worked as a housekeeper inside the Mission as she prepared to live independently again.

"I thank God I had the chance to go to the Anne Douglas Center," Alejandra says. "It gave me another chance at life."

As her healing progressed, Alejandra knew in her heart that Ricardo needed the same opportunity to transform his life.

"I was tired of letting people down," Ricardo says. "I needed to work on myself. To take responsibility for my actions and get my act together."

Ricardo was inspired by the change he saw in his mother, and he has been working hard to transform his life too.

"I'm glad I'm here with my mom," he says. "It's been a long time since I've had her by my side, so it feels good to be with her."

Alejandra agrees and says she is grateful for the help you are giving her and her son. "Thank you for believing in me and my son. Thank you for helping us change, move on with our lives and do good for ourselves."
