## From Life on the Streets to a Life of Purpose

Your Gifts Helped Put Antawny on the Fast Track to Success

For many years, Antawny's life was headed down the wrong path. Poor choices led him to the streets, where he lived for three years. Eventually he ended up in prison. But Antawny knew he was destined — and determined — to become more.

Antawny learned about Los Angeles Mission while he was in prison. Knowing he never wanted to be incarcerated or homeless again, Antawny came to us for help after his release. He began our Fast Track Program, which gave him the opportunity to advance his education and get back on his feet through employment.

The first step toward his new future was when Antawny enrolled at Los Angeles City College. Next, he was hired to work at a healthcare facility. After months of studying and working, in addition to tending to his responsibilities at the Mission, Antawny successfully completed the Fast Track Program.

He then enrolled in our Life Start Program to help him prepare even more for everyday life. Life Start is our transitional program that helps graduates re-enter society through a holistic discipleship program.

Today, Antawny continues to take classes to achieve his goal of becoming a licensed clinical social worker. At work, he's

also earning his certification to become a drug and alcohol counselor. "The Mission gave me a place where I can accomplish things in life," Antawny says. "I wouldn't have been able to do any of this if it weren't for the Mission. I'm thankful for everything they have done for me."

Looking ahead, Antawny says, "I want to go as far as I can. I want to continue my education possibly up to a master's degree. I want to work and live a decent life."

At Los Angeles Mission, we're here to provide ongoing opportunities for people in need. Because when people see there's someone who actually wants to help, it gives them hope and makes them think differently about their life.

Our programs have given Antawny the opportunity to grow, and your support gives him hope that someone cares. For that he says, "I greatly appreciate everything that you do to assist the Mission and help people like me."

Christina felt like she'd failed as a mother and had no idea how she could ever rebuild her life. She turned to drugs and alcohol to try to numb the pain, eventually resorting to sleeping on the Metro Rail when she had nowhere else to go.

Soon, Christina knew enough was enough. She was determined to give her children the best life she could. She happened to meet a Los Angeles Mission staff member at church, and she knew this was her best chance for change.

A short time later, Christina enrolled at the Anne Douglas Center, and she's never looked back. She finally received the emotional and spiritual support she needed. And, thanks to you, Christina's life has been transformed!

"The Christina before was hard," she says. "She was closed-minded. She was shut down. Today, I'm vibrant. I'm open. I'm funny. I try to make everyone around me smile."

Armed with a new mindset and skills, Christina is excited to be a productive member of society again and to give her children everything they need to thrive.

"Not only have you given me back my relationship with God, but you've opened the doors to better relationships with my children and my father," Christina says. "I'm just so grateful to you and the Anne Douglas Center."

## The Art of Giving

One of the earliest charitable gift annuities (CGAs) happened in 1831 between Yale University and a painter named John Trumbull. At the time, Trumbull was living widowed and poor, surrounded by nearly 100 paintings. He decided to donate them to Yale in exchange for a "competent annuity for the remainder" of his life. And the CGA earned its stripes in American history.

A CGA is a contract between a nonprofit and an individual who transfers their assets in return for an immediate tax deduction and an income stream for life. CGAs also:

- Provide the possibility of donating many types of assets
- Reduce capital gains tax liability
- Allow you to support Los Angeles Mission

One of the most remarkable things about John Trumbull isn't that he earned the title of "The Painter of the Revolution," it's that he did it with the use of only one eye.

Art critics believe this lifelong effect from a childhood injury is ultimately what influenced his detailed painting style. Today, millions of people continue to walk in Trumbull's shoes, creatively impacting lives through smart charitable giving.
