Dear Caring Friend,


When a person endures a period of homelessness, it's not just their physical health that suffers. There is an emotional anguish that can impact every part of their being — especially their mental health.

What Life Transformation Looks Like

Last year, Katrina was kind enough to share her story with us. Now, we're happy to provide an encouraging update.

Two days before Katrina was scheduled to undergo necessary surgery for a significant foot injury suffered at work, her procedure was cancelled by the hospital as a result of the pandemic lockdown. Because she could no longer work, she soon lost her car, and then her home.

After five months on the streets, she learned about Los Angeles Mission's Anne Douglas Center and came right away. "I felt like I was finally safe," she says. "I was so grateful to have a roof over my head again."

Shortly before graduating from our year-long recovery program, the Mission helped set up Katrina to get the foot operation that she needed. She went through rehab, and then secured a job where she provides case management and care for other people experiencing homelessness. As you can imagine, the work is very personal for her. "It's been a life-changing job," she says. "Helping them is a new passion."

Today, Katrina is continuing to stay at the Mission while she saves money, but now that she's healthy and mobile again, it won't be long before she has her own place. Since she's been here, she's gained a new community of support, she's earned professional certifications and her future is bright. No wonder she says, "Mission donors changed my life. They restored my dignity and my future, and I'm very grateful."

Because of your ongoing gifts and prayers, Katrina has hope again. Thank you for supporting this life-changing work.

Lawrence Experienced Healing and Restoration — Thanks to You!

When Lawrence was a high school student, he loved to play sports — and he excelled. But he remembers how a number of drug dealers infiltrated his peer group. They were friendly, they seemed cool — and they persuaded a lot of young men to try their products. Unfortunately, Lawrence was seduced by their act, and it cost him dearly.

While he had relationships, jobs and an honorable term of service in the Air Force, he also kept falling back into substance abuse. Eventually, he lost everything and wound up on the streets. For a time, Lawrence remembers, "No one could tell me anything." But when he was at rock bottom, he called his mom for help. Lawrence remembers, "She told me the best thing anyone could tell me: Go where God is, and I'll be alright."

That's why he came to Los Angeles Mission. And just as Lawrence's mom said, his life began to change for the better. One night, he went to the Chapel, where he had a "long chat with God. I told Him, if He would just take care of my kids and keep them safe, I would serve Him the rest of my life."

He continues: "God kept up His end of the bargain, and by His grace, I've done my best to keep up mine. My kids are doing great." As for Lawrence, he graduated the program, returned to the workforce and remarried. He has lived a life that honors God and man. The Mission gave him the tools to succeed, and he's incredibly grateful. "The Mission means the world to me. They didn't just care for

me, they reconnected me to God."



4 Wills That Won't Help

Don't Make These Mistakes With Your Estate Plan!

Your Will is one of the most powerful documents you will ever create! Through it, you can proactively care for your loved ones, minimize family disputes, reduce your heirs' taxes and legal fees AND make a powerfully impactful gift to Los Angeles Mission. However, there are four types of Wills that are *not* effective.

- 1. The Non-Existent Will Don't assume you don't need a Will because you don't have "enough," or because you've already vocalized your desires. A completed, legal Will is the only way to ensure your wishes are met and your resources (home, business, vehicles, personal collections, finances, etc.) are quickly and smoothly passed to your chosen people and charitable causes.
- 2. The Incomplete Will Meeting with an advisor, discussing your plans with loved ones and documenting your intentions are all important steps toward completing your Will. But until you have a properly written and signed Will that meets your state's legal requirements, your plan is just a concept or piece of paper with no legal bearing.
- **3. The Lost Will** An estate plan does no good if your loved ones don't know that it exists or where to find it. Once you have a completed Will, make sure to communicate important details to your family, such as the location and any password or keys they will need to access it.
- **4. The Out-of-Date Will** Things change over time and so should your plans. Key life transitions that warrant an update include children moving out of the house, retirement, marriages, births or adoptions, deaths, changes in financial situations, and more.
