Thanksgiving and the holidays are just around the corner, and this year has felt a little like a rollercoaster. There has been good news and progress dealing with homelessness and poverty in our community, but also challenges and a growing number of people in need.

Here at Los Angeles Mission, we're preparing for our biggest-ever Thanksgiving season. By God's grace and with your help, our kitchen team will prepare an estimated 432,358 meals to serve our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Additionally, we'll distribute around 200,000 more meals to neighbors in need through our Race to Feed program. This food plays a vital role in nourishing those on the edge of homelessness, who need every bit of help to keep a roof over their heads.

Making it all happen will require a tremendous effort, including about 1,000 volunteers (if you're not already, we'd be honored if you'd be one of them!). But it's worth it, because together, our efforts create real, permanent change for men, women and children fighting to survive on the streets.

There's no better time to celebrate this life-transforming care than during Thanksgiving. Every corner of Los Angeles Mission is filled with a spirit of gratitude during this season. And I thank God for you too, because you truly care about our least fortunate neighbors — and you turn that caring into action.

With tears in her eyes, Yolanda remembers the crisis that destroyed her life. "My son died. I didn't know how to handle it." Her life hadn't been easy before, but now things really fell apart. Her heartbreak was unbearable.

Descending into severe addiction to escape the pain, she suffered through homelessness and poverty, violence and abuse. She went to prison multiple times. Filled with shame, Yolanda was a broken shell of a person. "I didn't want to live," she says. "I was ready to give up."

After years of suffering, she cried out to a God she didn't really believe in for help. That very day, just a short time later, Yolanda got arrested. At first she was furious. But then she thought to herself, "God didn't say *how* He was going to help me." So she accepted her situation — went to jail, did her time and then came to the Anne Douglas Center for Women at Los Angeles Mission.

"When I got here, I was rebellious. I was a handful. Nobody could tell me anything. But the difference between this place and other programs I tried is that they help you change on the *inside*. I know God now, and I'm filled with His love."

A few years ago, Yolanda was alone for Thanksgiving. "I didn't have anything to be thankful for," she says. This year will be very different. She'll celebrate with her family. Her heart will be filled with new joy and confidence for the future, and she's grateful to friends like you who made it possible.

How Much Should I Leave to Ministry?

"How much should I leave to Los Angeles Mission and the other ministries close to my heart?"

It's a practical question asked by those who are working out the details of their Wills or Trusts.

Your best answer depends on your circumstances, objectives and values. However, many families consider one of three giving models.

- 1. Percentage or Tithe. Many individuals allocate a certain percentage of their Will toward Los Angeles Mission and other Kingdom causes. Some designate 10 percent to reinforce tithing to their families.
- 2. Child Named Charity. Some families choose to add a "child named Charity" to their Wills. By this method, for example, if a couple had four children, each of the children would receive 1/5 of their estate, and the remaining 1/5 could go toward charity.
- 3. Gifts of Assets. People often designate real estate, business interests, retirement assets, machinery or even personal collections as gifts to Los Angeles Mission. There are a number of reasons people do this, whether it's because the property has special meaning, their children have no further use for it or because they wish to protect their families from unnecessary taxes.

What's the right answer for you? It may be helpful to talk with a trusted ally who can help you sort through the options to determine the best fit for your goals and circumstances.
