# The Fall and Rise of the Big Man on Campus

"In high school, I was kind of the big man on campus," Michael remembers. "I was the starting quarterback on the football team, and I dated the head cheerleader."

After high school, Michael went into the military and served honorably. "When I came home four years later, all my friends had started careers and families," he says. It was very humbling for Michael, and he felt unsettled. "People I used to look down on now had homes. I wasn't the big man on campus anymore, and I didn't know how to handle it."

The uncertainty and insecurity he felt led Michael to begin hanging out with the wrong crowd. Before he understood the seriousness of what was happening, Michael was caught up in drug addiction. As a result, he spent more than 20 years of his life on the streets of Los Angeles. He lived in "cardboard condos" on Skid Row, ate out of dumpsters and went months without showering.

#### A Pathway to Renewal

Six months ago, after years of misery and suffering, Michael decided to check out Los Angeles Mission.

"Two days in, I wanted to leave," Michael says. "But my chaplain grabbed hold of me and spiritually handed me over to Jesus. It's like he said, 'Jesus, Michael is yours.' From that day, Jesus started working in me."

After so many years of going without, Michael finally had reliable food and shelter. He dove into his classes and Bible studies, faced his "character defects," slowly grew closer to God — and God started to transform his life.

"I have a vision of staying sober, being productive again and letting God use me," he says. "After going hungry and being homeless, I thank God for this place and all those who support it. Because of them, I'm surrounded by so many people who love me and are committed to helping people like me."

# You Gave. Now Dawn Is Giving Back . . .

Last year, we shared Dawn's story in Crossroads. Abandoned by her mother on Skid Row when she was only 10, Dawn suffered for years through homelessness and addiction. But thanks to you, she came to the Anne Douglas Center for Women at Los Angeles Mission, experienced spiritual renewal and rebuilt her life. Today, we share a special update about how she's doing.

"Coming to the Anne Douglas Center for Women led to healing and transformation that continues today," Dawn says. "After I graduated, I started working in the mental health field, right here on Skid Row where I grew up."

Serving people who were experiencing homelessness gave Dawn a tremendous sense of purpose and meaning. "I feel like everything I endured as a child made the work I do today possible," she says. "I serve people in recovery, helping them get housing and counseling. I'm helping them, not from inside of a program, but outside on the streets."

Dawn also works with parolees from state prison to help them get re-established.

Today, she is attending college to earn her master's degree so she can

provide mental health services directly in the correctional facility itself. She's also engaged, and will be getting married soon.

In short, her life is entirely transformed — change she credits to Los Angeles Mission and friends like you. "The Mission donors mean everything to me," she says. "I wouldn't be here without them. They saved my life."
