Thanks to You, Jose's Life Is Transformed



Jose has been drinking for nearly as long as he can remember.

"I grew up in a small town in Mexico where there are a lot of blue agave plants," he says. "That's what tequila is made from, and everyone drinks it. It was a cultural thing. I probably started when I was about 6. So did all the other kids."

Sadly, what seemed like innocent fun back then carried a lifetime of consequences that no child could understand. Eventually, Jose left his small village and migrated to Los Angeles, where he worked as a jack-of-all-trades — "carpentry, electrical work, auto repair, cleaning apartments, a little bit of everything," he remembers. "But I was drinking more and more, and it was hard to hold on to jobs. Many times I tried to stop, but I would always relapse."

Finally, Jose ended up experiencing homelessness on the streets. It was a dangerous life. "I believe the only reason I survived is because the Holy Spirit was always close to me, protecting me," Jose says. In February last year, Jose decided he wanted to change and joined the program at Los Angeles Mission.

"Since coming here, I've gotten closer to God, and I read my Bible every day," he says. "The Mission is not only helping me stay sober, but they're also helping me with some of my legal issues. I'm thinking a lot more clearly now, but I also have a lot of regrets. I've lost all contact with my family, but I hope, now that I'm sober, that I can find them again."

What Real, Permanent Change Looks Like — Qiana's Story

When Qiana first walked into the Anne Douglas Center for Women at Los Angeles Mission, she wept, overwhelmed with hopelessness. She was determined to transform her life, but that would mean facing her past.

"I experienced a lot of abuse and trauma as a child — everything you can think of," Qiana says. "When I was 23, I found drugs. It was just recreational for a while, and it helped mask the trauma still in my head." But as is always the case, addiction steadily seized



control of her life and destroyed it.

Five kids and a painful divorce later, Qiana ultimately lost her home, her real-estate license — and worst of all, custody of her kids. She ended up living in her car in total despair.

"Then I met I the man I'm married to today," Qiana says. "He encouraged me to get my kids back. Even though I was pretty hopeless, I started to think maybe it was still possible. He had his problems, but his mom and her pastor recommended I go to the Anne Douglas Center for Women at the Los Angeles Mission."

She says the Center gave her the time she needed to get sober and heal mentally and physically. It gave her structure and the tools she needed to be a better mother. One year later, the court impressed with how far she'd come — returned her kids to her.

Though she lost one of her children in a tragedy, Qiana still says, "God is faithful." After completing our program, she ultimately married the man who encouraged her recovery years before. Now, she's a successful entrepreneur and the leader of a nonprofit that honors her son's memory by helping other young people facing homelessness and hardship. "Thanks to the donors who supported me and my children, I'm able to give back to others," she says.

Will vs. Living Trust: Which Do I Need?

Both Wills and Living Trusts are effective tools to provide for the future needs of your family. Both can also be used to support Los Angeles Mission and the other causes close to your heart.

A Will contains your instructions to the court about who should receive what after your lifetime, and who should oversee the process. It may also designate care for minor children, family members with special needs or pets. A Will takes effect at the time of your passing, and you can change it at any time for any reason.

A Living Trust, on the other hand, is a way of holding your assets while you are still alive. Like a Will, it can provide future instructions, but it may also protect your family from delays and extra costs by avoiding the probate court process. You can name yourself or another person to manage Trust assets during your lifetime.

Which of these do you need? It's not necessarily an either/or. You certainly need a Will, and you might need a Trust as well. Your trusted professional advisors can assess your needs based on your goals, where you live and the complexity of what you own.
