

# When Brian realized his life depended on getting help, you were there to make sure he got it.

For years, Brian lived a kind of double life. In person, he was outgoing, self-assured, happy and the personification of a true salesman — his chosen profession. But underneath the mask was a man filled with insecurity, shame and overwhelming fear that someone might find out the truth about him.

The truth was, Brian had spent years enduring homelessness on the streets. As the years went by, he couldn't hold onto jobs because of drugs and alcohol. It got harder to hide the truth, and his fear and insecurity grew.

### The Drink That Changed His Life

"Early last year, I went to a party," he says. "I picked up a bottle of Gatorade and drank it. I didn't know it, but it was laced with some kind of drug. Next thing I knew, I ended up in the emergency room. I almost died. God got my attention. My life was at sake — I needed help."

When Brian came to Los Angeles Mission, he finally had to admit he wasn't the man he pretended to be — or who God wanted him to be.

### Surrounded by a Community of Love

"I never really had a spiritual life before," Brian says. "When I came here, I started learning about God. But the big thing was being around so many people who loved God, who loved me and who spoke truth to me. They show me who I really am, hold me accountable and help me change. I'm building a network of godly people that I'll take with me for the rest of my life.

"I'm grateful for the donors, because they're the ones who made it possible for me to grow into the man I know I really am."

# When Kelley Needed to Start Over, You Made It Possible

After graduating from Los Angeles Mission in 2006, Kelley stayed sober for 17 years. In her South-Central neighborhood, she modeled the powerful presence of Christ, serving her neighbors in need. But last February, growing drug abuse and gang violence in the area forced her to flee.

"My sobriety and mental health are priceless, right?" she says. "I wasn't going to allow anything to affect that. So, I had to walk away and start over from scratch."

Kelley knew just where to go
— right back to the Anne Douglas
Center for Women at Los Angeles
Mission, where her new life
started so many years ago.



The Anne Douglas Center for Women at the Los Angeles Mission means a lot to Kelley. Not only is it where she finally conquered her own long-time addiction, it's where she learned to authentically follow Jesus. It's where she learned to give back by pouring her life into others.

"When I called, they gave me a bed in their Bridge Housing, which allows me to stay there for free until I save enough money to afford a new place to live."

Kelley, however, is determined to pay back the grace she has received. "I have the chance to speak life into the other women in recovery here," she say. "I'm also leading a study of the Alcoholics Anonymous Big Book."

In the meantime, she serves as head chef at a recovery center in Pasadena, where she not only cooks but mentors other women. "I call it ACTS — A Call to Service," she says.

"Thank you," she says to our faithful donors. "When I needed it, you gave me the chance to start over. You made sure I didn't have to become homeless again."
