Daniesha was in a serious accident when she was 17 that left her unable to work and on medication for seizures. A self-professed "daddy's girl," Daniesha was very close to her father, as well as her brothers. She looked to them as her protectors and support network. Their deaths within a few years of each other turned her life upside down.

"After my dad passed away, my world came crashing down," she explains. Daniesha was in her early 30s at the time. With her entire support network gone, life began to spiral as grief and the sense of abandonment became overwhelming. After a series of bad decisions, she ended up living in her truck with her infant child for the next year.

#### A New Path Ahead

Late one night, Daniesha was pulled over by officers who had a warrant for her arrest. She spent the next several months in jail before being sent to the Anne Douglas Center for Women at Los Angeles Mission.

Here, Daniesha received meals, shelter and the opportunity to get her life back on track. Once she completed the initial drug program, she entered our year-long, life-transforming recovery program to help her deal with her feelings of loss and grow stronger.

#### **Grateful for Change**

With hope for the future, Daniesha now says, "I just want to be happy and raise my kids. I have a 24-year old, a 17-year old, a 4-year old and a 6-month old grandbaby. I'm so grateful for the supporters who have helped me change my life."

### José's Journey from Rock Bottom to Renewal

Becoming a father was a special moment for José. He was happy planning a life with his girlfriend and newborn son. Sadly, his plans abruptly changed when his girlfriend took their son and abandoned José.

Far from home and family, José felt broken and lost. He began drinking to escape the loneliness and despair, and in a moment of extreme weakness, he tried drugs to numb his pain.

That decision resulted in eight years on the streets of LA, suffering every imaginable

indignity as he tried to make sense of just how broken he'd become. At rock bottom, the cycle of homelessness, hunger, addiction and incarceration led to a court order sending José to Los Angeles Mission — the best thing that had happened to him in a very long time.

Since being at the Mission, José has developed a real relationship with God. In his words, "My mind is maturing. I know the path I was on was not good, and now I can find value in myself." José hopes to reconnect with his family and eventually see his son again.


