## Thanks to You, Dimson Is No Longer Walking in Shame.

Dimson is grateful for friends like you who made his transformation possible!



Dimson grew up in the Philippines. His father was often away, working overseas. By the time his family moved to America, rebellion was already at work in Dimson's life. He enlisted in the Navy and served five years, but life spiraled afterward and before long, he was arrested for drug possession. After his release, Dimson spent the next seven years unhoused. Ashamed and not wanting his family to see how he was living, he made his way to Skid Row.

Robbed at gunpoint the first night, Dimson was left with nothing to his name except the clothes on his back and a gnawing hunger in his belly. "I needed to eat. That's when I walked into Los Angeles Mission for the first time," he shares.

#### **Recovery Began With a Meal**

Soon, Dimson learned about the programs available to him at the Mission. However, it wasn't until that rock bottom moment that he took the next step. He explains, "I have three children. One day I was watching a family on the streets and started thinking of my kids and how far gone I was. That was my turning point."

Dimson recalls how he entered our program in 2012 so full of shame. But, he says, "I saw that Jesus' disciples sometimes didn't want to get close to people who were diseased. But Jesus would hold them, talk to them and eat with them. Jesus looked at them with no shame, and I realized ... that's my God!"

#### What a Renewed Life Looks Like

In the years since Dimson graduated, he's met his goals to pay back child support and became involved in each of his children's lives. One of his daughters is now born again and two are living with him in L.A.

**Dimson is extremely proud of the job he started** at a local Jiffy Lube after graduation. He is still amazed that he went from not being able to manage his own life to managing an auto shop! Today, he is the lead mechanic and trains other new personnel — including two other graduates from the Mission.

## When Jessica needed one more chance, she found it here, thanks to you!

Trauma from Jessica's past kept her locked in a desperate cycle of destruction. Her life went from teenage rebellion . . . to becoming pregnant at 17 . . . to surviving attacks from her verbally, physically and emotionally abusive boyfriend who was seven years her senior.

She tried to escape by turning to drugs and alcohol, but things only went from very bad to worse, and she was eventually arrested.

When Jessica had her day in court, the judge said, "I see such good in you," and gave her the option of serving eight years in prison or coming to the Anne Douglas Center for Women at Los Angeles Mission.

#### Now Jessica says, "The Christian program here is different than others. This allows you to get into the Bible . . . to learn about Jesus . . . and that there is a purpose for your life."

Thanks to friends like you, Jessica has had the opportunity to deal with past trauma and find healing and hope here. "One of my favorite classes is relapse prevention," she shares. "They get to the core of your triggers and teach you prevention skills."

Of her life before, Jessica says, "I was completely broken, just at the end of everything. Today, I see someone with strength and ambition." She now hopes to regain custody of her 9-year-old son and start what she calls "a normal life."

## Now and Later: Tax-Wise Giving from Your IRA

Many Los Angeles Mission supporters increase their generosity's impact and tax efficiency by giving now or later from their individual retirement accounts.



1. Give now. If you are over 70  $\frac{1}{2}$ , you have an exclusive giving option that's far

more tax-efficient than giving from your checkbook or wallet. You can give up to just over \$100,000 (indexed annually for inflation) in qualified charitable distributions. This will satisfy your required minimum distributions and lower your taxable income.

2. Give later. Extend the impact of your giving well beyond your lifetime! When you leave your IRA to your loved ones, you create a taxable event for them since it will be treated as income. However, when you name Los Angeles Mission as a beneficiary, the entirety of your gift goes to the ministry — tax-free!

Whether you give now or later, or both now and later, giving from your IRA is a smart way to eliminate taxes and further this ministry that means so much to you.
