

Raven Will Begin a New Life This Holiday Season, Thanks to You!



Not long ago, Raven was living a life she loved. She had a job helping people with special needs find employment and gain independence, and she found the work immensely rewarding. Then COVID came along, things shut down and her job went away.

Discouraged, Raven started drinking as a way to pass the time. But little by little, alcohol got a grip on her life. **The breaking point was when her sister suddenly passed away.** Raven was overcome with grief, and in an attempt to escape the sadness and just get through each day, she gave in to alcohol.

"I would drink to feel normal and be able to do my day-to-day things, including caring for my sister's kids," she says. "That went on for about nine months, with me drinking every day."

Just when Raven thought things couldn't get any worse, she was involved in a fender bender and was found to be driving under the influence. Because she had three of her nieces in the car with her, Raven's DUI charge included child endangerment. She was facing 11 years behind bars.



Because you care, Raven will graduate from our recovery program in November!

In lieu of prison time, the court allowed Raven to enter our Anne Douglas Center for Women, where we welcomed her with love and without judgement. She's deeply grateful for the opportunity:

"I'm getting back in touch with God. We have different classes here that are refreshing what I've already known about the Bible and just getting me deeper into my study."

As Raven works through her recovery, she's learning new skills to help her cope with grief, as well as tools to distract her from the urges and cravings of addiction. And she's eternally thankful for friends like you who have given her this fresh start. "That's Christian … that's what grace is," she says.

'I'm in God's Hands Now.'

Jesús knows what hard work is all about. In his early teens, he dropped out of middle school to help his family by selling bread and working fields in Mexico. Noble as that was, he quickly discovered the 14-hour shifts — from 3:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. — were too much for his young body to handle. In a desperate but misguided effort to keep up with the work, he used meth to get the energy he needed to make it through the long days.

Over time, **Jesús's need for meth grew and grew**. It seized control of his life and turned him into a person he couldn't have imagined. Ultimately, he spent two years in prison. Upon his release, he was deported back to the U.S., where he was born. Jesús hoped for a fresh start in Bakersfield and resumed his work ethic, toiling away on fruit farms and sending money to support his mother, who is losing her sight. But it wasn't long before the cravings for meth came back to haunt him.

Through a series of unfortunate events, Jesús lost everything he owned. Depressed and feeling lost, he made his way to the Los Angeles area, where he spent five years on the streets struggling with homelessness and addiction. But things began to look up for him the day he walked into Los Angeles Mission in search of a meal and hope.

"I had tried another program before, but I ended up relapsing after two days," Jesús says. "I really believe God brought me here because this is a place where they prepare you to go back into mainstream society and be drug-free, and I'm building a strong relationship with God. I'm really learning the Word and I'm in God's hands now."

During this season of thanks, Jesús would like you to know how grateful he is for the hope you've given him: "This place is a blessing, thanks to you!"


